Friends,

My love affair with Rhône varietals, the many different grapes grown in the Rhône wine region of France, started back in 2002 with a humble half ton of Roussanne grapes we bought from our neighbor George Besson Jr. My old winemaker buddy Dave liked lesser-known grape varieties, and somehow scouted out this single row of Roussanne grapes hiding along one edge of the rambling Besson Vineyard a few hundred yards east of us. Well, it made a great wine, so the next year we planted some Roussanne and Viognier to see how well they would grow at our Estate.

As it turns out, our area is a really good climate for these varieties; just warm enough to ripen them up if you leave them hanging long enough on the vine. Sometimes we don't harvest Grenache until Halloween, which is inconveniently late in the harvest season, but it makes a really great wine. I remember one year we picked the Grenache the first week of November, with literal icicles hanging off the irrigation lines - true story!

By 2006, I was completely over the moon about all the different grapes of the Rhône. Grenache is well known, and Syrah; but most people had never heard of Mourvèdre, Picpoul, Cinsault or any of the other 30-odd varieties grown in that warm area near Provence. I was determined to make a red wine and a white wine, blended "in the style" of my favorite Rhône area, the Chateauneuf-du-Pape.

I visited the quaint and lovely little town of Chateauneuf-du-Pape in 2008, taking a break from cooking school for a weekend and meeting some old French friends there for some wine tasting. What a glorious little town, with a thousand years of history and lots of good restaurants. And powerful, earthy wines.

As time went on, my naturally curious mind kept demanding more and more of these funny varieties be planted. Now we have quite a long list of Rhône grapes that we grow and make wine with: Viognier, Roussanne, Grenache Blanc, Picpoul Blanc, Clairette Blanche, Grenache Noir, Mourvèdre, Syrah, and Counoise - 9 in all, and that's enough for me. From this long list we make four wines every year; a Viognier, a Syrah, our white blend Madonne Blanc, and our red blend Madonne Rouge. This shipment has our latest vintage of the Madonne blends, and we're confident you'll like them.

We are also really excited to share our first Pinot Noir from a new vineyard source in Santa Rita Hills. Rancho La Viña is a small vineyard that an old buddy now manages. He reached out a couple years ago and invited us to work with them. They give us a lot of love, and they are a small grower that really takes pride in their work. Best of all, the grapes are fantastic, and our 2021 and 2022 vintages are truly excellent wines. Cheers!



MEMBERS' WINTER RELEASES





2020 Madonne Blanc, Estate

The S.V. Madonne Blanc is our take on the traditional white wines of the southern Rhône Valley. It is named for local Mount Madonna and is a marriage of California soils and climate to a classically styled blend of estate-grown, Rhône varieties. In the vineyard, we worked hard to limit vigor to help the vines focus on fruit production. With no threat of harvest time precipitation, we safely let the fruit hang well into the fall for full phenolic ripeness. We hand-harvested and whole cluster pressed the fruit from the home ranch on multiple pick dates in late September and early October. The wine was fermented in stainless steel and transferred to neutral oak barrels for maturation after dryness for seven months, with stirring of the lees every two weeks. To create our estate Madonne Blanc, we actually make 4 individual wines, then blend them carefully to make the best wine we can. In the 2020 vintage, the final cépage was 53% Roussanne, 21% Grenache Blanc, 21% Clairette Blanche, and 5% Picpoul Blanc. The '20 Madonne Blanc displays bright citrus aromas and flavors of Meyer lemon and lime, as well as pastry - think key lime pie. The wine is bright with balanced acidity and a creaminess on the palate. The 2020 Estate Madonne Blanc would pair well with a roasted beet salad with goat cheese or a citrusy chicken piccata.

2021 Pinot Noir, Rancho La Viña, Sta. Rita Hills

This is the fourth release for Sarah's Vineyard with fruit sourced from the Santa Rita Hills, and our first release from the Rancho La Viña vineyard. Located in Santa Barbara County, the Sta. Rita Hills is part of the larger Santa Ynez Valley AVA. The hills of the district run east to west, which allows cool ocean breezes from the nearby Pacific Ocean to enter the valley, providing fairly cool microclimates – perfect for growing top-flight Pinot Noir. Dense morning fog gives way to sunny afternoons, and loamy soils make Rancho La Viña and incredible cool climate growing site. In addition to 34.5 acres of top-quality Pinot Noir wine grapes, a variety of other crops are also grown on the ranch, which includes 126 acres of the best walnuts in California. We are excited to have been invited to work with this small, quality grower that really takes pride in their work – and feel that this vintage is a truly excellent wine. The wine spent eleven months aging in French oak barrels, one third being new wood, which added polish and length. The '21 Sarah's Vineyard Rancho La Viña Pinot Noir has a vast bright red fruit presence of cherry, raspberry, and crushed pomegranate. Along with the freshly picked red fruit aromas and flavors are notes of chocolate and a hint of violets. On the palate, all these elements are complemented by baking spice and a hint of vanilla with smooth, silky tannins. This Pinot Noir pairs wonderfully with the enclosed recipe from Tim for Creamed Chestnut Soup.

2019 Madonne, Estate

The Sarah's Vineyard 2019 Estate Madonne reflects its southern Rhône heritage through a blend of the region's traditional red varieties: 64% Grenache, 20% Mourvèdre, 12% Syrah, and 4% Counoise. Yields at harvest in our Rhône blocks were about average. We hand harvested the fruit at the end of September and the beginning of October. After destemming the whole berries, we fermented at low temperatures in small lot vats. Hand punch downs were used prior to pressing to French oak barrels for eighteen months aging in primarily neutral cooperage to preserve the exceptional, complex fruit character of the blend. The '19 Madonne displays a rich dark fruit presence full of dark cherry, blackberry, blueberry and raspberry along with savory notes of pepper, anise, clove and cocoa powder. The estate Madonne will complement a rib eye steak with herb butter or grilled portobello mushroom perfectly.
